

- IN NEW MEXICO, THE TERM ACEQUIA REFERS TO BOTH THE PHYSICAL CANAL THAT TRANSPORTS IRRIGATION WATER AND TO THE ASSOCIATION OF PARCIANTES WHO GOVERN, MANAGE, AND MAINTAIN THEIR OWN IRRIGATION SYSTEM. THESE COMMUNITY-BASED IRRIGATION SYSTEMS REMAIN THE OLDEST WATER MANAGEMENT INSTITUTIONS OF EUROPEAN ORIGIN IN THE U.S.
